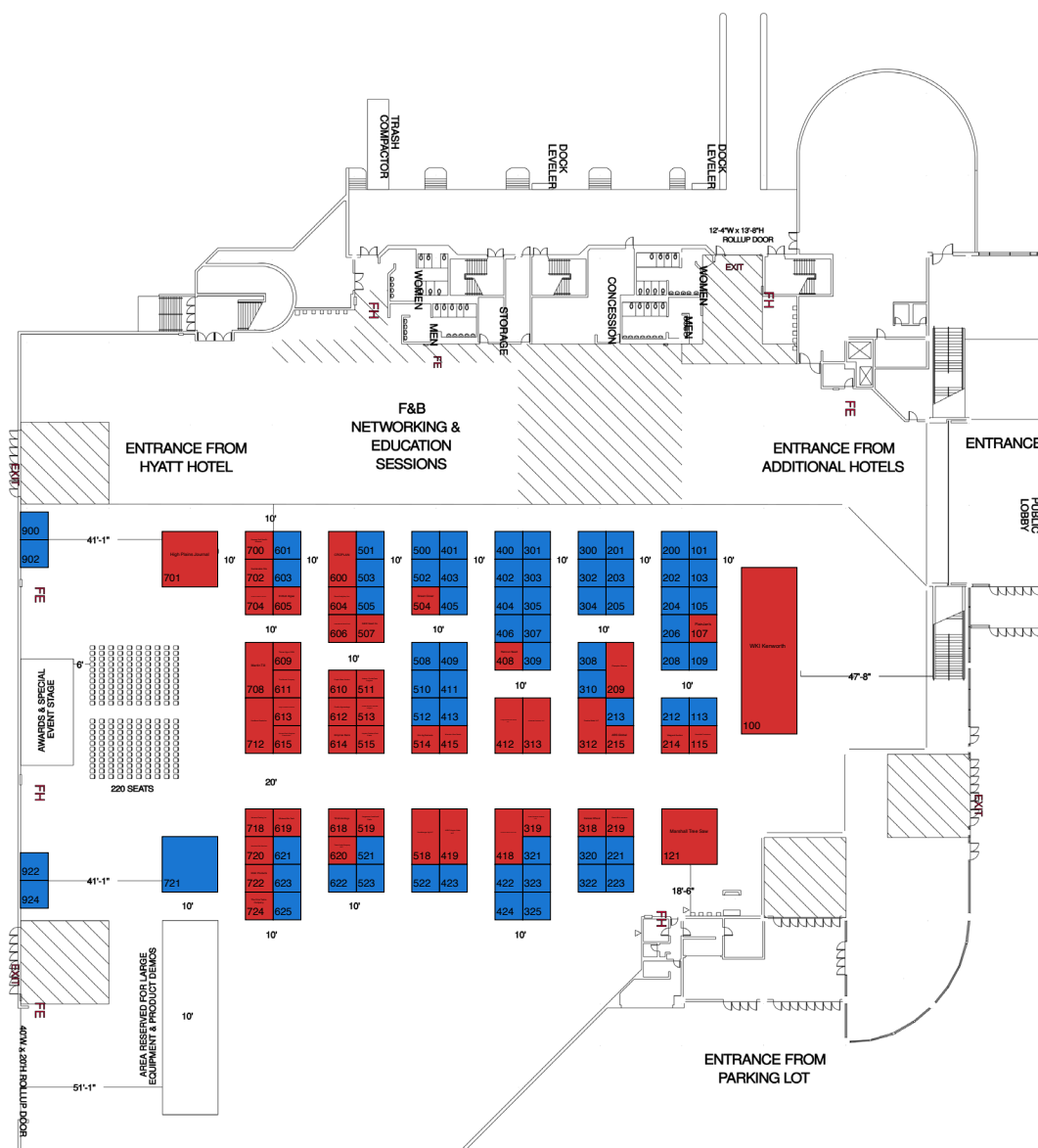

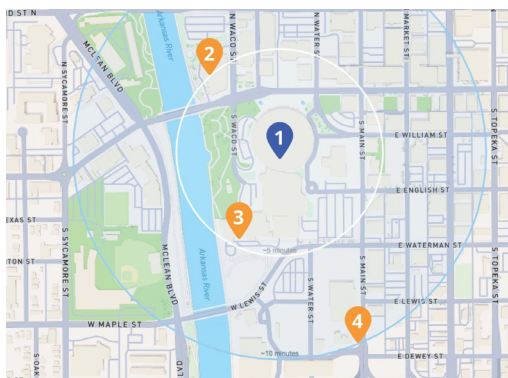

Drury Plaza Hotel Broadview Wichita

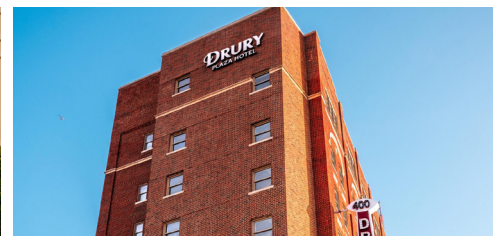
